INTRODUCING CROWLE COLTS FOOTBALL CLUB

Crowle Colts' history goes back, through several name changes, to 1963 when Axholme Wanderers began in the Scunthorpe League. The club's crest shows the date 1992, the year the Junior section commenced and three years after the senior side had competed for seventeen seasons in the Lincolnshire League (as Crowle United).

The spell in the Lincs League had been prompted by a treble success in the 1970-71 season when United had been crowned Champions of the Scunthorpe League, Challenge Cup winners and, at Brigg Town's Hawthorns ground, winners of the Lincolnshire FA Junior Cup. The club returned to the Scunthorpe League at the beginning of the 1990s and, while always being able to field a strong side, didn't reach the heights of earlier days. League Champions again in 2017-18, the Colts entered the Central Midlands League for the following season and gained promotion in its first campaign, missing out on the title on goal difference. Three seasons in the top division (the first two of which were cut short by covid) brought continued improvement and a switch back to the Lincolnshire League at the beginning of 2022-23.

A third-place finish matched the best final position of United's spell in the Lincs League, andwas surpassed the following year as the Colts finished as runners-up to Nettleham, scoring in the process a record total of one hundred and forty-nine league goals. A memorable night at Lincoln City's LNER Stadium saw Crowle win the Lincolnshire Junior Cup after extra time against the then-holders Wyberton.

The County Cup was retained in 2024-25 after a five-one victory in the final over Ruston Sports, a club which would deny Crowle a first Lincolnshire League Championship on the last day of the season when a one-all draw left the Colts in second place despite only losing one league game all season. Continued improvements on the field were matched by developments around the club's Windsor Park home and the Northern Counties East League accepted Crowle Colts as a member at the beginning of 2025-26.
